## HOW TO VOTE IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

### **To Vote in NH you Must:**

- Be at least 18 years old
- Be domiciled in New Hampshire
- Be a U.S. Citizen.

Students in New Hampshire can register to vote in the city or town where they live while attending school.

### **How to Register to Vote:** You'll need to show documents that prove your eligibility to vote:

- **Identity and Age:** Driver's license, government-issued photo ID, or passport
- **NH Residence:** Driver's license, government-issued photo ID, vehicle registration, government-issued tax document, or government-issued check that lists your residential address. (If you don't have one of these, call our hotline!)
- **If you are registering to vote in New Hampshire for the first time, you will also need to prove U.S. citizenship** with a birth certificate, U.S. passport, naturalization papers, or by signing a qualified voter affidavit attesting to your US citizenship.

Student IDs are not accepted for voting.

### **Where to Register to Vote:** You can register to vote in person at your city or town clerk's office or at your polling place on Election Day.

You can also register to vote by mail if any of the following is true:

- You will be absent from the town or city on the dates/times when the Supervisors of the Checklist meet to receive voter registration applications;
- You are unable to register in person due to a physical disability; or
- You are confined to a penal institution for a misdemeanor or while awaiting trial but otherwise qualified.

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## How to Vote In Person on Election Day

### 1. Bring your Photo ID and (if required) other documents

- If you've moved within NH, bring photo ID and proof of residence.
- If you're registering for the first time in NH, bring photo ID, proof of residence, proof of citizenship\*

\*If you don't have the required documents, you can sign an affidavit attesting to your US citizenship.

### 2. Check <https://app.sos.nh.gov/> to find your polling place location and hours!

## Acceptable Forms of Photo ID Include:

- Driver's license issued by any state or federal government;
- Non-driver ID card issued by NH DMV or motor vehicle agency of any state;
- Photo ID card for "voting identification only" issued by NH DMV;
- United States armed services identification card; and
- United States passport or passcard

Student IDs are not accepted for voting. Expired IDs are accepted for 5 years after expiration – or, for voters over 65, at any time after expiration.

## How to Vote Absentee (by Mail)

**You can only vote absentee if you are unable to vote in person for certain reasons**, such as absence from town, a physical disability, a religious commitment, an obligation to care for an adult or a child, or an employment obligation.

### 1. Request your absentee ballot:

- Fill out this application: [bit.ly/NHabapp](https://bit.ly/NHabapp)
- Include proof of ID (by photocopy, by showing photo ID in person to the town clerk, or by notarized signature).
- Return the form to the clerk by mail, fax, email, or hand delivery, allowing for time to receive and mail your ballot!

### 2. Complete and return your absentee ballot as soon as possible!

- In person: must be received by your clerk by 5:00pm on Election Day.
- By mail: Put it in the mail at least 10 days before Election Day!
